STANDARDISED PRICE LIST

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help think through your options and make choices, andto let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices ca vary).

ATTENDED FUNERAL (funeral director's charges only) This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for thedeceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation. Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements

Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of the funeral director' £300 premises) into the funeral director's care

Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at the funeral £200 director's branch premises

Providing a suitable coffin – this will be made from oak veneered £350

Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeraldirector (where viewing is £50 requested by the customer)

At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person direct to the agreed cemetery or cremat £640 (normally within 20 miles of the funeral director's premises) in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle

UNATTENDED FUNERAL

This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event orservice for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or forreopening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctors' fees as well. This is the charge for twodoctors to sign the Medical Certificates for Cremation.
